

Alpaca hunt


This picture is full of alpacas. Every alpaca has a twin – except for one.

Can you find out which alpaca only appears once?




Find the right path!

Mountain code breaker

An exciting adventure awaits high up in the mountains: you have to crack the mountain code. It's a mysterious number key – hidden behind symbols, colours, and small clues. To break it, you'll need clever minds, a little patience, and a lot of team spirit.

Try, experiment, and have fun together – in the hotel room, at a mountain hut, or at home. It's not about language, but about logic, patterns, and observation – ideal for all age groups.

Can you crack all the codes?

Puzzle 1: A pair

Task:

There are ten white socks and ten black socks in a bag. What's the minimum number of socks you have to take out to get a pair?

Puzzle 2: Sticks

Task:

How many ends do two and a half sticks have?

Puzzle 3: Months

Task:

Some months have 30 days, others 31. How many months have 28 days?

Puzzle 4: Mountain creatures

Task:

A fox ran through the snow first. Then came a badger. Then a deer. They all left behind tracks. Each animal is assigned a number:

Fox = 3

Badger = 5

Deer = 2

The children find the tracks in the snow in the following sequence: deer – badger – fox – fox What is the code?

PS: Use the second number for the final mountain code.

Puzzle 5: On the bus

Task:

There are 12 passengers on a bus. When the bus stops, eight of them get off and seven new passengers get on. How many people are on the bus now?

Puzzle 6: The competition

Task:

You're taking part in a race. After a while, you overtake the person in third place. What place are you now in?

Puzzle fun to pass the time: toothpick brain teasers

If the kids are getting bored – waiting in a restaurant, on a rainy afternoon, or between activities – you can keep them occupied with matchstick or toothpick puzzles.

These simple sticks can be used to set tricky tasks that encourage logical thinking, creativity, and patience – without a screen in sight. Just grab a few toothpicks are you're ready to begin!

Puzzle 1: Make the square disappear.

Place four toothpicks in a square.

Task:

You're only allowed to move one toothpick. How can you make the number 4?



Puzzle 2: Turn 3 into 2.

Use three toothpicks to make a Roman numeral: III

Task:

Move one toothpick so that only the number 2 (II) is visible.



Puzzle 3: Make a hit from nil.

Spell out the word N I L with toothpicks (all capital letters)

Task:

Move 2 toothpicks to make the word HIT.



Puzzle 4: Turn one triangle into two.

Place 3 toothpicks in a triangle.

Task:

Pick up a fourth toothpick: where can you place it to turn one triangle into two equal-sized triangles?



Puzzle 5: Correct the sum.

Lay out the following sum with toothpicks:

VI + IV = IX

Task:

You're only allowed to move one toothpick: how can you make the sum correct?





Puzzle 6: Turn one square into two rectangles – using 5 toothpicks.

Make a square using four of the toothpicks.

Task:

You can only add one toothpick – how do you create two equal-sized rectangles?



Puzzle 7: Fly in a glass.

Use 5 toothpicks to make a "glass" and put a "fly" (e.g. a small object) inside it.

Task:

Move three toothpicks so that the fly is outside the glass.

Puzzle 1: 2 Puzzle 2: 6

Puzzle 3: all 12 months

Puzzle 4: 2 - 5 - 3 - 3
Puzzle 5: 12 (11 passengers and 1 bus driver)
Puzzle 6: 3

Puzzle 1: Remove the top toothpick brain teasers

Puzzle 2: Remove the top toothpick and place it vertically under the right-hand toothpick. Now you can see a 4.

Puzzle 2: Remove one of the outer toothpicks.

Puzzle 4: Place the toothpick lengthwise in the middle − now the large triangle is divided into two small ones.

Puzzle 5: Turn the IX (9) into X (10) → then: VI + IV = X → is correct!

Puzzle 6: Place the 5th toothpick lengthwise in the centre to create two rectangles

Puzzle 7: "Move" your toothpick glass to the left or right. If you move it to the left, take the two toothpicks on the right and the base of your glass and simply move them to the left-hand side. Now the fly is outside, to the right of the glass. The same works in reverse.
